## The MDS 2025 Annual Meeting and the Sustainable Development Goals

The <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> (SDGs, also known as the Global Goals) are 17 goals with 169 targets that all UN Member States have agreed to work towards achieving by the year 2030. They set out a vision for a world free from poverty, hunger and disease.

- 4. Travel grants. MDS 2025 is also offering 15 travel grants of up to \$1,150 and 5 grants of up to \$1,500 for participants from low-income countries. These grants will support presenting authors of the best abstracts selected by the scientific committee. Eligible authors must be under 40 years old, and the grants will cover travel and visa expenses.

Supporting accessible high-quality education for our community is our top priority. Throughout the organization of MDS, we strive to constantly improve the scientific program, introduce more accessible Meeting alternatives and support onsite attendance, eliminate gender disparities in education, and ensure long-term education for our attendees.

In Rotterdam, resilience is a way of life. This dedication positions Rotterdam as an unmatched destination for hosting impactful and sustainable events.

De Doelen is one of the seven partners of 7 Square Endeavor. This international collaboration and sustainability project has the mission to prepare cities for the future. It responds on a local scale to global urbanization and its adverse consequences such as pollution, heat stress and flooding. Smart and innovative use of energy is one of the spearheads of this project. The Schouwburgplein (square in front of de Doelen) serves as a testing ground for new innovative technologies, cyclical processes and business models. The Rotterdam square is the first in a series of seven worldwide.

- Delegate badge collection and recycling at the end of the event.
